 - If your parent(s) were not required to file a 2023 federal tax return, please submit a Parent Non-Tax Filer Statement.

If your parents are divorced, separated, or were never married and are living apart, your noncustodial parent is required to complete the Noncustodial Parent CSS Profile online if you are applying for need-based institutional grant aid.
